### Karen Mason Kastning

NSS 12164 March 25, 1946 - April 6, 2023

Karen Mason Kastning, age 77, passed away at Carilion Roanoke Memorial Hospital on Thursday, April 6, 2023, after a brief illness. She was preceded in death by her parents, Daniel Boone Mason and Mildred Mason; and her siblings, Joan, James, Michael, Jeanne and Pamela. Survivors include her son, Ernst H. "Kass" Kastning III, his wife Yunha, and their children, Aayla, KJ, and Austin; sisters, Barbara Scheib (Carl) and Peggy Perkins; brother, Gary Mason (Deborah); and many other family members and friends, including her former husband, Ernst H. Kastning Jr.

Born in Baltimore, Maryland, she lived in San Antonio, Texas until 1979. Following a couple of moves, in 1985 she relocated to her present home in Radford, Virginia.

Karen received her B.S. Degree in Geology from the University of Connecticut and M.S. in Geology from Radford University. Professionally, she was employed at Studer's Photography in Texas (1967-1979). She later taught geology courses at Radford University and New River Community College. She was also employed with the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality in Roanoke from 1997 until her retirement in 2016.

Of her many life-long interests, the most prevalent were caves. She began caving in Texas in 1967 and visited, mapped, photographed, and studied caves in 40+ states and internationally. She was active in local and regional caving groups, having served as an officer and on committees. She joined the National Speleological Society (NSS) in 1969 and held various positions, including chairperson of the annual photographic salon competitions, and maintaining the photographic archives. She attended 45 NSS conventions, held across the U.S. serving on the organizing committee for many years. Honoring her 50+ years of dedication to the caving world, she received several recognitions

including the NSS William J. Stephenson Outstanding Service Award, its highest award, in 2011.

Karen served as a governor appointee on the Virginia Cave Board of the state Department of Conservation and Recreations from 1987 to 2004. Karen authored and coauthored numerous publications on caves, history, and conservation. Karen was an active conservationist and participant in preserving groundwater quality and the environment.

Karen enjoyed visiting natural and historic sites around the world. As a descendent within the greater family of Daniel Boone, she became interested in genealogy and was a member of the Boone Society where she served for many years as the editor of their journal, *Compass*. Her other interests included hiking, history, photography, needlework, dollhouse miniatures, and horses.

A Celebration of her Life will be held in Virginia at a later date. An Urn Burial Service for close family and friends will take place in San Antonio, TX on July 8, 2023.

## Grotto Trip Log

**3/18: Butler Cave, VA.** Participants included Susan Burr, Lauren Appel, Nick Schmalenberger, and Kelly Perkins; the leader was Amos Mincin. They did a little digging in the Air Dig and explored some other areas in the cave.

3/26: Hanging Rock Orange Market cliffs, VA. Vertical practice went well; organized by Susan Burr and led by Nick Schmalenberger.

**4/1: Hanging Rock Orange Market cliffs, VA**. Vertical practice went well; organized by Susan Burr and led by Nick Schmalenberger.

4/12: Unnamed Cave, VA. Participants included, for survey: David Socky, Joe Zokaites, and Rick Royer. For digging: Amos Mincin and Jeremy Davis. For surface geology mapping: Rick Lambert, Keith Sweeney, and Bill Koerschner. Explored past the point where Rick Royer had enlarged the hole at the bottom of the cave. Some digging was involved. Joe, Rick Royer, and I surveyed while Amos and Jeremy worked on digging. Rick Royer also did some digging on the tight continuation of the passage while Joe and I surveyed the high lead at LGP8. The high lead still goes but requires protection (the whole climb up should be rigged). The dig at the end of the cave still goes on too, but it requires some more technical digging to let us big folk get through. By the way, an 85-foot rope is perfect for tying off at the surface and reaching the first rigged pit in the cave. We were in the cave for 8 hours and got a total of 127 feet of survey in the book.

**4/13: Catfishes Pot (Gory Hole), VA.** Participants included David Socky, Brian Williams, and Terry McClanathan. Terry was the only one to do the pit. He recovered an \$800 dog collar

from a dog that had fallen to its death 3 months ago. It stank pretty bad. Terry definitely gets kudos for getting the dog collar. Terry also measured the pit with a 200-foot tape to 134 feet!

4/13: Catfish Caverns (Catamount Cave), VA. Participants included David Socky, Brian Williams, and Terry McClanathan. We went in with Brian carrying a mason hammer in order to try and get into the narrow lower canyon. The rock was too thick, so we were unsuccessful. A few sessions with straws would do the trick. Brian got some really cool photos of the sunbeam shining into the entrance. We then ridge walked for 4 hours but didn't find a thing.

4/22: McClung Cave, WV. Participants included David Socky and Carl Amundson. We went to Outer Mongolia and surveyed the lower-level leads in the northern section of Outer Mongolia. We then went to the southern section and checked the first low lead on the left. Turned out to be a nice room after a short climb down, a 10-to-12-foot pit, and low drain canyon which T'd into another stream passage. To the left it went to the bottom of the pit, so no vertical stuff will needed on the next trip. To the right the canyon went for 30 feet or so and continued, but I stopped because I'd reached my 'scoop' limit. We then headed out. It was a good 10-hour trip with 410 feet in the survey book.

4/25: Madison Saltpeter Cave, VA & Steger's Fissure, VA. This was the CCV/DCR project to re-gate Madison Saltpeter by so it would have a bat friendly gate. The gate construction was done by Jim (Crash) Kennedy, It was a weeklong project involving lots of iron, highlines for hauling, trail building, welding, etc. I spent three days and 2 nights at the site. We also gated Steger's Fissure.

4/29: McClung Cave, VA. Participants included David Socky, Joe Zokaites, Bill Koerschner, and Alex Faunce. We went to Outer Mongolia and surveyed the lower level lead that Carl and I had found on the previous trip. We surveyed the initial lower room and the 10-foot-deep pit, then the passage that led back around to the bottom of the pit. Alex and I surveyed a mid-level lead on the side of the pit which ended in a double dome/ room after only a few feet. There was a high lead where the water was coming in but would require bolting. Going the other way - downstream - continued tight, gnarly, and muddy. There were places where Joe and I barely fit. We eventually got to a point where the passage ended in breakdown and a dig. We dug for several hours. Seven feet of clay and rock until we broke out into a large stream passage up near the ceiling. No safe way to climb down, but there was a survey station - BTO22. We called it a day after that. This was a good 11.5-hour trip with 420 feet surveyed - all new cave.

5/6: Phil Lucas Dig, VA. This was a drilling activity to bore a 3-inch hole 80-feet down to find the void that Phil's resistivity studies indicated should be there. The drill went down 110 feet and found no void. Darn. Lots of clay and probably sandstone. No limestone and no void. Mark Minton, Nick Socky, Alex Faunce, and I also worked on the dig just 100 feet from the drill site that Phil had started earlier. The dig was supposedly close to the upper end of the void. Lots of sandstone. We did a little technical digging too, which proved to be pretty effective. We dug down about 2 feet. No hole to follow - just dirt and rock.
